Banfield Foundation - HOPE Funds	Funding	https://www.banfieldfoundation.org/Banfield-Foundation-Grant-Programs	HOPE Funds program offers financial assistance for income-qualified pet owners whose pet is suffering from an immediately life-threatening condition. You do not need to be an existing Banfield Pet Hospital® client to apply for HOPE Funds, but treatment and the application process will need to be done at a Banfield Pet Hospital. Due to the high demand for assistance, not everyone who applies for HOPE Funds will be approved, and the entire cost of your pet's treatment will not be covered. All applications submitted must be reviewed for both medical and financial eligibility. Please contact your local Banfield Pet Hospital for more information and eligibility.

Cornell University Hospital for Animals	Funding	https://www.vet.cornell.edu/cvm-receives-grant-subsidize-cancer-treatment-pet-owners	Cornell's College of Veterinary Medicine (CVM) has received a three-year, \$350,000 grant to subsidize the cost of cancer treatment for dogs and cats. By establishing a "Petco Foundation & Blue Buffalo Foundation Cancer Treatment Support Fund," the Cornell University Hospital for Animals will be able to provide financial assistance for owners who could not otherwise afford the cost of treating their pets with cancer.

Grants are only for covering injuries received by abuse or neglect.

Red Rover - Domestic Violence Assistance - AKC Humane Fund	Funding	https://redrover.org/domestic-violence-and-pets/	<p>The RedRover Relief Safe Escape grant program helps families with pets safely escape domestic violence together. Funding is mainly provided to help with the cost of temporary pet boarding while a client is in a domestic violence shelter, though other costs associated with boarding (like vaccinations) can be considered. Assistance does not typically cover pet boarding once the client has moved from the safe house into transitional housing.</p> <p>Grant applications are reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Grants are awarded based upon several factors, including: urgency, financial need, and available funding. Applications must be submitted online by a domestic violence advocate, and a</p>

			response via e-mail or by phone will be provided within one business day.
Friends & Vets Helping Pets	Funding Services	https://friendsandvetshelpingpets.org/	Friends & Vets Helping Pets funds treatments for curable (lifesaving, not life-prolong) diseases such as tumors, broken bones, ambulatory care, expensive medication, or post-surgical prosthetics such as a K-9 cart. Grants are made to individuals and families whose ability to pay is extremely limited, but also to those of somewhat more substantial means, up to 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, who may only need minor subsidy to meet the veterinary expenses. Financial aid is intended as a supplement to family resources. All applicants must be prepared to show financial need.

Often animals are put down or suffer needlessly because their owners cannot afford expensive surgery or medical treatment. Companion animal owners must often make the difficult decision to put an animal down or neglect medical needs because of the costs involved.
Live Like Roo	Funding	https://www.livelikeroo.org/	Live Like Roo, a volunteer-run 501C3 organization, provides support and financial assistance to families whose pet faces a cancer diagnosis. They pay bills for biopsies, amputations, medications, growth removals and much more.

This nonprofit provides grants up to \$2,500. The grants do not cover things like dental work, ongoing treatments, or end-of-life care. Visit their website for more eligibility information.
Help-A-Pet	Funding	https://www.help-a-pet.org/apply.html	Help-A-Pet's mission is to provide financial support across the US for pet owners who can't afford their pet's medical care. In order to qualify, your annual income must be under \$20,000 if you're an individual household. For a family household, the annual income must be less than \$40,000. Since funding is limited, this nonprofit can only provide financial help once per pet.
Joshua Lewis Animal Cancer Foundation	Funding	https://www.joshualouis.org/	This nonprofit organization focuses on raising awareness and funds for animals with cancer. When pet owners are unable to cover treatment themselves, the foundation can help with financial support.
Diabetic Cats in Need		https://dcin.dreamhosters.com/compassionate-assistance-program/	Our One-Time Assistance Program provides a glucose testing kit and a few months' supply of insulin to those who do not qualify as low-income but have been hit by the shock of a new diagnosis and need some time to save up for the long term costs. This does not require proof of income status, just written justification from the caregiver about the need for the supplies. Along with the supplies, advice is given on good care for feline diabetes and keeping costs down going forward. Our Compassionate Assistance Program provides ongoing assistance with insulin, testing supplies, and limited veterinary care to folks who qualify as low-income caregivers.
The Magic Bullet Fund	Funding	https://themagicbulletfund.org/	For those financially unprepared to pay for their dog's cancer treatment, this nonprofit aims to close the gap. It is important to note that Magic Bullet Fund doesn't offer grants, but raises donations to cover medical care. Since this is an ongoing process over the course of several weeks, this fund is not ideal for help with immediate treatments.
The Mosby Foundation	Funding	https://themosbyfoundation.org/	Since 2003, this organization has been working to help neglected, sick, and abused dogs. Dog owners can apply to have procedures and treatments covered. However, the foundation cannot help with vet bills you've already incurred.

Scratch Pay	Loan	https://scratchpay.com/	You can apply for a payment plan and Scratchpay will pay your vet immediately. Unlike CareCredit which is a credit card, Scratchpay is a temporary loan. In addition to their 12-month and 24-month payment plans, they also have a Take 5 plan which allows you to split your vet bill up into five payments.
